

The purpose of this funding is to provide support for students for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care) or child care.

An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA.

Delaware Valley University has signed and returned the certification and agreement to the Department of Education. The University will use the designated funds to provide emergency financial aid grants to students.

Guidance received by the Department of Education that students should have "exceptional need" when considering students for funding with priority given to those students. Those students with Federal Pell Grants have exceptional need. The university established a tiered awarding approach to awarding eligible students based on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the resulting Expected Family Contribution (EFC). Amounts awarded were based on the EFC. Range \$800 for highest need students to \$200 for those deemed to have financial need or otherwise eligible for funding. Amount was further determined based on enrollment as a full-
